# LOST BOYS, STOLEN TRUCKS

### Overview

The boys are not alright.

#### Synopsis

Lost Boys, Stolen Trucks is a program of short films by Iowa filmmakers Philip Rabalais and Auden Lincoln-Vogel. Made between 2017 and 2024, these four films about the absurdity of boys trace an artistic collaboration between two filmmakers who continually steal each others' ideas, whose themes and characters get lost, cropping up years later in the other's films. Centering around trucks as objects of desire (and anxiety), as vehicles of escape (and destruction), these four films explore dynamics of male friendship (and enmity) through surreal and genre-bending forms.

#### Directors' Statement

We have a hard time getting our films screened. They're not traditional 'narrative' films, nor do they fit into what might be described (paradoxically) as the orthodoxy of 'experimental' film. Reflecting on the past half decade of collaborating, we noticed a selection of our short films that are full of spooky resonances: characters that seem to wander out of one film and into another, subverted storylines that resurface years later, shots that crop up in multiple films, even titles that are outright stolen. Making films



in lowa on miniscule budgets, we are simultaneously liberated from the cultural and economic pressures of the film industry, but also stymied in our desire to show our films. Our program *Lost Boys, Stolen Trucks* tries to kill two birds with one stone: screening our films for a curious audience, and demonstrating an approach to filmmaking accessible to any weirdo with a camera and friends.
